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# MA in International Relations & Cultural Diplomacy

## REGULAR TRACK

### Introduction

The MA in International Relations and Cultural Diplomacy is a two-year program offered by the Furtwangen University in partnership with the Academy for Cultural Diplomacy.

- **Credits** - 120 ECTS Credits
- **Length** - 4 Semesters
- **Location** - Berlin, Germany
- **Professional Development** - The Professional Development Training Program provides students with the opportunity to apply in practice what they learn in theory in their studies and gain valuable professional experience. The program is completed during the second semester of studies.
- **Tuition** - €12,000

The degree provides a comprehensive foundation of studies through a unique blend of academic education in international relations, political science and multiple academic fields, related to the unique relationships that exist between various nations and cultures & the interaction of nation-states and non-governmental organisations in fields such as politics, economics, security and culture. A particular emphasis is put on successful strategies, policies and practices of cultural diplomacy for the achievement of international and transnational co-operation & soft power objectives, whether in the public sector, private sector or civil society. The curriculum provides students with expertise in two distinct academic fields, combining both an academic and practical advantage in the global arena, and preparing them for careers in diverse fields such as international relations, politics, international business, the humanities and culture.

The program addresses contemporary international issues, with classroom seminars and lectures, as well as educational & cultural events, conferences, professional trainings, tours, visits and meetings with foreign officials, which are further incorporated into the curriculum. Students meet with leading experts working in international organizations, embassies, and academic institutions, and engage with specialists in the areas of international relations & economics, business, communication, politics, human rights, culture, peace building, multilateral diplomacy, conflict resolution and development.

The program also provides students with practical experience and prepares students for careers in the above-mentioned diverse fields. On a practical level, the international environment of the Center for Cultural Diplomacy Studies offers students a unique opportunity to interact with leading experts and academics at a wide variety of international organisations and research

centers. Students are empowered as critical partners, working with peers and university staff to define, develop and transform the learning environment and their own learning experience. They act as collaborators and co-creators in the production of knowledge, engaging in research and investigation throughout their program of study. This exceptional learning environment leads to original research and independent study opportunities. It allows students to create a solid professional network and form a concrete base for future academic and professional career choices, preparing students for engagement in the international arena, in the private sector, the civil society, politics, governmental organisations and international economic organisations.

One of the main goals of the Professional Development program is to enable students to acquire job opportunities and develop their careers in institutions such as the UN, EU, African Union, national governments, national parliaments, international corporations and international NGOs. ### Program Structure

The program consists of 120 ECTS credits in total and has duration of four semesters, which all take place in Berlin, Germany.

The program follows the conventional university structure of a two academic years' program divided into four semesters. Students are offered elective courses to accompany mandatory courses, professional development experience and the final thesis.

The first 2 semesters are conducted by the Center of Cultural Diplomacy Studies (CCDS). The First semester will consist of three mandatory modules and two Facultative courses. The second semester will consist of the professional development program and 2 Facultative courses. The 3rd Semester and the 4th Semesters are conducted by the Furtwangen University (HFU), Berlin Campus. The 3rd semester will consist of mandatory modules. On the 4th semester the students will produce a final thesis on a related topic of choice. At the end of the fourth semester, the students will be then required to submit their Thesis.

\*The program is structured as a 4 Semesters' program, however Students who wish to finalize the program earlier, can submit their thesis prior to the final deadline (prior to the end of the fourth semester).



## Program Curriculum

### ● SEMESTER 1 ( 30 Credits)

The main priority of the curriculum for the first semester is to provide students with a solid foundation and understanding of the history and contemporary practice of Cultural Diplomacy and International Relations, as well as future applications of the field.

### ● SEMESTER 2 ( 30 Credits)

During the second semester, students will undertake a professional development and training program at the Institute for Cultural Diplomacy as well as two 2 facultative courses. The professional development program is designed individually with each of the students and is composed of part or all of the following main components:

- Research
- Development of own Initiative / project, supported by the Center.
- Participating in and contributing to ICD's Projects, Activities and Conferences
- Involvement in independent Initiatives
- Internship in external Organizations and Institutes

Students are required to complete a Master's Dissertation during their fourth semester of study, and will be provided with guidance on how to choose an appropriate topic, how to identify and locate the necessary sources. The topic, structure, and length of each Dissertation will be subject to individual review and Faculty mentor approval.

### Program Structure

The program consists of 90 ECTS credits in total and has duration of two semesters, a Professional Development Training Program, designed individually for each student and a thesis to be written during the 3rd semester and to be submitted towards the completion of the program.

The program follows the conventional university structure of 3 Semesters: one academic year divided into two study semesters, where Students are offered facultative courses to accompany mandatory courses, a professional development experience, and the final thesis to be submitted after the 3rd semester, which is dedicated to the thesis writing.

\*The program is structured as a 3 Semesters' program, however Students who wish to finalize the program earlier, are able to submit their thesis prior to the final deadline (prior to the end of the third semester).

In the 21st century, bilateral and multilateral relations have assumed a greater importance than at any time in history before; cultural diplomacy has therefore become imperative in maintaining and improving political, economic and social environments worldwide. These developments have significantly increased interest in the study of Cultural Diplomacy and at the same time have created a crucial need for professionals who understand and have experience with the field.

Concurrently, the diminishing power of the individual nation state, combined with the international nature of modern issues (such as global politics & economics, global governance, global health, climate change, terrorism and human rights), contributes to a growing demand for interdisciplinary academic instruction.

Expertise in one field alone no longer guarantees professional success and it is therefore vital that those aspiring to work in fields including international relations, governance, business, management and diplomacy have an advanced understanding of a number of interconnected relevant disciplines.

University programs striving to provide students and young professionals with the fundamental understanding and practical skills necessary for careers in international affairs must therefore adjust their programs accordingly.

Our Graduate Programs, which operate under a joint partnership with leading universities, offer unique educational programs that educate students from around the world in the above-mentioned academic disciplines and methods.



### Scope of the Degrees

We offer innovative Master and PhD programs that provide a new approach to international relations, global economics, global governance, management and cultural diplomacy. The programs are pioneering, and unique in their content and offer valuable professional development programs. - **Professional Skills, Knowledge, Experience and Relationships** - To equip students with the relevant skill sets, knowledge, professional experience and professional relationships, so that they will be able to acquire a job immediately upon completion of the degree. One of the main goals of the CCDS is to enable students to acquire job opportunities and develop their careers in institutions such as the UN, EU, African Union, national governments, national parliaments, international corporations and international NGOs.



### 3 Key Benefits of the Programs

The degrees are distinct in offering major key benefits. Some of the key benefits can be found below:

- **Expertise in a Minimum of Two Leading Academic Fields** - The programs provide students with expertise in at least two distinct academic fields (such as cultural diplomacy as well as international relations), which will give them a significantly greater number of career options against students who simply have an expertise in only one field, such as International Relations only.
- **Professional Development Programs** - The Professional Development programs provide students the opportunity to acquire knowledge and skills, experience and relationships in the traditional areas of international relations in general as well as in institutions and organizations such as in the UN, EU, AU, national governments, national parliaments, international corporations and international NGOs. This professional experience that is provided for the students is the main scope of the professional development program and is designed specifically in order to provide students with the best tools in order to develop their careers and to acquire jobs in these institutions and organizations.
- **Hybrid Model of University + NGO Partnership** - The programs consist of a unique structure that provide students with the opportunity to study in the university and at the same time to gain practical experience, by having the opportunity to participate in and support the activities of an NGO. This will save students time in their careers and guarantee that they will have this experience in their CV. # Application Process

The academic components of the MA Programs which are conducted fully in Berlin are administered by the Furtwangen University (HFU) and the Center for Cultural Diplomacy Studies (of the ICD Academy for Cultural Diplomacy).

## Accreditation

The Master's Degree programs are awarded by the Hochschule Furtwangen University (HFU), which is recognized as a fully accredited institution of higher education with the right to award university degrees.

The HFU is a state university of Baden-Württemberg - Germany. It is accredited by AQUIN with all its study programs and quality ensuring processes via an institutional accreditation (Systemakkreditierung).

All MA programs are accredited within the framework of this institutional accreditation according to federal law according to § 33 Landeshochschulgesetz Baden-Württemberg (LHG).

The Furtwangen University (HFU) is part of the Bologna Process set in place by the European Commission, and uses the European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS) to award degrees. Credits obtained through the MA program are equivalent to those of courses at universities in all other 30+ signatory countries. Students will earn 30 credits per semester during the MA program, for a total of 90- 120 credits upon completion (pending on the track).

## Application Requirements

Individuals studying for an MA will represent a diverse range of cultural and academic backgrounds. Candidates will include recent BA graduates as well as young professionals who combine strong academic backgrounds with significant work experience. Individuals are required to hold a BA degree (or equivalent Degree) of minimum of 3 years studies, as degrees from across the world and from any field are acceptable\* /\*\*. We do not consider any one element of an application exclusively. Rather, our admissions panel considers academic achievement as well as personal qualities such as strength of character, motivation and the ability and willingness to take on new academic challenges. Our aim is to attract students from a variety of backgrounds and countries that will foster a unique and diverse learning environment.

*\*Current undergraduate students are able to submit an application and participate in the pre-enrolment process, by submitting a confirmation of their current studies in good standing and their transcripts.*

*\*\*For the 90 ECTS MA program (the one year- or short track of the MA program of only 3 semesters), the BA studies must have a total of minimum of 210 (European transfer Credit points) or 420 UK Credits (normally 4 years BA studies). Once the BA degree of the applicant has total of 180 ECTS credits only (180 European transfer Credit points) or 360 UK Credits only (normally 3 years Studies), individuals are required to have additional professional of one year and/or additional academic experience/extra curriculum Credit Points of min. 30 ECTS.*

## Language

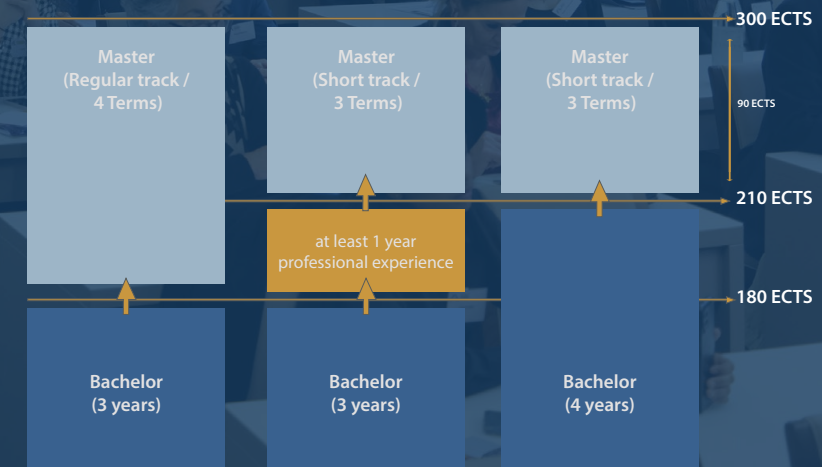
All courses are taught in English, thus an evidence of adequate competence in English is required for the applicants whose mother tongue is not English. A minimum of CEFR B2 English proficiency level must be proven to be eligible for the degree program. (see also below). German language is not a requirement.

## Application Procedure

Once submitting the online application form, the admission office will refer to the student with an e-mail, indicating the application reference code and outlining all the next steps, including the supporting documents required for the application, and an interview to be conducted (Via Skype/Phone).

### The supporting documents required for the application process:

- **Official Undergraduate/Graduate Degree Transcript:** A copy of an official undergraduate degree (and of graduate degree, once applicable) transcript, which list all the courses included in the undergraduate degree and the course grades. If the transcripts are issued in a different language than English or German, a certified translation in one of the two languages has to be submitted.

- **Official Diploma:** A copy of the official diploma from the university that awarded the undergraduate degree (and the graduate degree, once applicable). If the document was issued in a different language than English or German, a certified translation in one of the two languages is to be submitted.

\*Current undergraduate students are able to submit an application and participate in the pre-enrollment process by submitting a confirmation of their current studies and their transcripts.

- **Passport Copy:** A scanned copy of the passport photo identification page should be submitted (the information on the passport should be clearly readable).
- **Motivation letter:** A personal statement of at least 1 and up to max. 2 pages (A4) explaining the motivation for undertaking the MA Program, in view of academic and/or professional background and future career plans.
- **Curriculum Vitae (Resumé):** This should include information of academic background (institutions attended, courses studied); professional experience, once applicable; hobbies and interests; any awards or scholarships received and full contact details. The curriculum vitae should be no longer than 2 A4 pages.

- **English language competencies:** A minimum of CEFR B2 (upper-intermediate) English proficiency level must be proven to be eligible for the degree program. You can provide this proof by submitting one of the following recognized English proficiency test results (the results should not be older than two years):  
Minimum score required is: TOEFL (PBT): min. 500; TOEFL (iBT): min. 72; TOEIC: min. 785; IELTS: min. 6.0; Cambridge English Certificates: B2 First (FCE)

You are exempt from submitting an English proficiency test score if any one of the following conditions is applicable:

- You have completed an undergraduate degree at an institution in one of the English country speaking countries listed below, OR
- You have completed a graduate degree at a university in one of the English country speaking countries listed below, OR

You have been employed for at least three years in a position in which English was the language of business in one of the English country speaking countries listed below, OR

You have completed an undergraduate or graduate degree at a university where English is listed as the only language of instruction on the International Association of Universities World Higher Education Database (WHED).

\* English speaking countries as defined by the HFU for the English proficiency regulations are: USA, Canada, United Kingdom, Ireland, Malta, Barbados, Trinidad and Tobago, Bahamas, Guyana, Australia, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Fiji, Samoa, Tonga, Solomon Islands, Micronesia, Vanuatu, Kiribati, Singapore, the Philippines, Sri Lanka, Malaysia, South Africa, Nigeria, Cameroon, Kenya, Zimbabwe, Ghana, Rwanda, Sudan, Botswana, Ethiopia.

- **Essay:** A writing sample of between 2-5 pages on any topic related to the fields of the program or former/current studies. You are not required to write a new essay especially for the application, and may submit any paper/essay you wrote in your former studies.
- **Employment verification letters (once available):** Letters on the professional experience from the organization where the applicant was positioned, including start and end dates -month and year- of the position; the framework, title and a brief description of the tasks in your position held.





## Financials

### Short Track MA Programs

The tuition fee for the short track MA programs stands on **9,000 Euros** for the full program for all students. The fees cover only the tuition fees (including examination fees and administrative fees), and do not include housing or any other living costs and related expenses which students may have.

*Installments: The tuition fees are paid in 2 instalments:*

*The First Instalment of **5,175 Euros** is required to be paid upon acceptance to the program in order to activate the Registrations on the Program.*

*The Second Instalment of **3,825 Euros** is required to be paid prior to the start of the second semester.*

- \* For the MA Program International Management and Global governance:  
The First instalment of 4,500 Euros to be paid upon acceptance to the program and of 4,500 Euros to be paid prior to the second semester.

### Regular Track MA Programs

The tuition fee for the regular track MA programs stands on **12,000 Euros** for the full program for all students. The fees cover only the tuition fees fees (including examination fees and administrative fees), and do not include housing or any other living costs and related expenses which students may have.

*Installments: The tuition fees are paid in 2 instalments:*

*The First Instalment of **6,900 Euros** is required to be paid upon acceptance to the program in order to activate the Registrations on the Program.*

*The Second Instalment of **5,100 Euros** is required to be paid prior to the start of the third semester.*

- \* For the MA Program International Management and Global governance:  
The First instalment of 6,000 Euros to be paid upon acceptance to the program and of 6,000 Euros to be paid prior to the second semester.

## Personal Costs

The ICD Academy offers Students Rooms in the Academy Campus Student Residences and is happy to assist you with advice and support for finding your housing and offer you possible affordable accommodation solutions.

## Scholarships

Limited Scholarships, equalling up to 10% deduction of tuition costs are available for students based on educational excellence and financial need. Although each scholarship request will be evaluated on an individual basis, students are expected to have an above-average grade point of 4.5 (of 5.0) in order to qualify for a grant and then to prove financial need.

Further to these scholarship offered by our Schools, Students are welcome to search for scholarships, such as from governments, or other Institutions. With regards to how to obtain such funding, we encourage Applicants to consider relevant foundations, institutes, organizations, companies and Governments as possible sources. A number of students on our MA programs have been able to acquire funding from their governments, companies or from relevant foundations. We do not have any specific sponsor to which we can refer students. Please note that our programs are not funded by DAAD or supported by Bafög.
